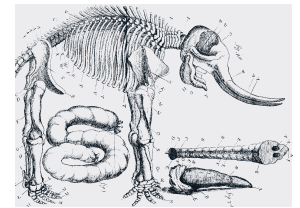
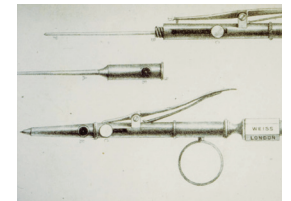




1 Each number stop corresponds to an audio track. Walking distance: 2.5 km (35 mins)



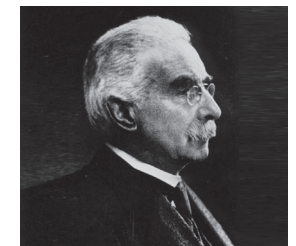
5 Mullen's anatomy of an elephant (1682).
